III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

This duty suspension bill is intended to cover lighting fixtures, with housings or bodies made from plastics, that are determined by Customs to be nightlights.

China is the dominant supplier of miscellaneous electrical lighting of plastics. China accounted for 85 percent (\$1.1 billion) of total U.S. imports under HTS subheading 9405.40.80 (a broader category than is covered by the bill) and 90 percent of dutiable imports in 2011.

We suggest that the article description be modified as shown in section II, above. It is not possible to provide an accurate estimate of claims for retroactive treatment under this bill because the covered product is not separately identified in the HTS or in official trade data. Moreover, Customs officials would need to apply the proposed article description to each shipment for which such treatment is claimed and decide if the goods concerned are covered by the proposed heading.

To suspend temporarily the duty on nightlights of plastic.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN NIGHTLIGHTS OF PLASTIC.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new headings:



8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by9 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn

from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day
 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (c) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.—Notwithstanding
4 section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514)
5 or any other provision of law, upon proper request filed
6 with U.S. Customs and Border Protection before the 90th
7 day after the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry,
8 or withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of any ar9 ticle—

10 (1) that was made on or after January 1, 2011,
11 and before the 15th day after the date of the enact12 ment of this Act, and

13 (2) with respect to which there would have been
14 no duty if the amendment made by subsection (a)
15 applied to such entry or withdrawal,

16 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if such amendment17 applied to such entry or withdrawal.

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
