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PREFACE

This series of quarterly reports on the U.S. nonrubber footwear industry is published by the U.S. International Trade Commission pursuant to a request from the Senate Committee on Finance. In a letter received on August 10, 1984, the Committee requested that the Commission institute an investigation under section 332 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1332) for the purpose of preparing and publishing quarterly reports on nonrubber footwear. In response to this request, the Commission instituted investigation No. 332-191 on August 28, 1984.

The Committee requested the reports in order that it might monitor the condition of the industry on a quarterly basis. The Committee requested that the quarterly reports include data on (1) production and/or shipments, (2) imports, (3) exports, (4) apparent consumption, (5) market share, (6) employment, and (7) unemployment. In addition, the Committee requested that the Commission provide, on an annual basis, information on plant closings in the industry. The Commission publishes information on plant closings in the reports covering the fourth quarter of each year.

HIGHLIGHTS

U.S. production.--U.S. output of nonrubber footwear declined for the fourth consecutive year in 1993 (table 1). Production decreased by less than 1 percent from the 1992 level, the smallest decrease during the 4-year period. After showing year-over-year growth in the first half of 1993, production fell by 7 percent in the third quarter and by less than 1 percent in the fourth. By contrast, the value of U.S. producers' shipments of domestic nonrubber footwear increased by 15 -percent for all of 1993 to a high of \$4.1 billion.

The U.S. industry continued to lose market share in 1993 in volume terms as its share dropped by 1 percentage point to 12 percent. In value terms, the U.S. industry gained some as its share rose to 29 percent in 1993 from 27 percent in 1992. Employment in the U.S. industry continued its downward trend, dropping by 4 percent for the year to 61,500 persons. According to the Footwear Industries of America (FIA), eight U.S. plants closed and one plant opened during 1993.

U.S. imports.--U.S. imports of nonrubber footwear exceeded the 1 billion pair level for the first time in 1993, when they totaled almost 1.1 billion pairs. They **grew** by 7 percent in the fourth quarter, bringing the total import gain for the year to 9 percent, the greatest annual growth in a number of years. As a result, imports supplied a record 88 percent of the domestic market for nonrubber footwear.

Most of the increased imports continued to come from China, which for the first time supplied more than half the domestic market for nonrubber footwear. China's shipments in 1993 rose by 23 percent over the 1992 level to 622 million pairs, representing 51 percent of apparent U.S. consumption of nonrubber footwear. China's dominance in the domestic market reflects its extremely low costs. Nonrubber footwear from China in 1993, on average, cost \$6.23 a pair, or about one-half the average cost of \$12.13 a pair from all other sources.

Brazil was the only other major supplier to record double-digit growth in 1993, solidifying its ranking as the second largest supplier of nonrubber footwear. Its shipments that year advanced by 22 percent to 130 million pairs, or almost 11 percent of the domestic nonrubber footwear market. Brazilian footwear, mainly leather shoes, on average, cost \$10.74 a pair.

Indonesia remained the third largest volume supplier of nonrubber footwear, although the growth in its shipments slowed considerably in 1993. Following an increase of 132 percent between 1990 and 1992, imports from Indonesia grew by just under 10 percent in 1993 to 84 million pairs. The slowdown partly reflected sluggish U.S. demand for leather jogging shoes, which Indonesia ships in large quantities.

Taiwan and Korea, once the major shoe suppliers, continued to experience substantial declines in their nonrubber footwear exports to the United States. Their combined shipments, having fallen in half between 1990 and 1992, were down by 43 percent in terms of volume to 83 million pairs, valued at almost \$1.1 billion in 1993. Shoe producers in Taiwan and Korea, faced with rising operating costs and strong currencies, have been moving production offshore, especially to China and Indonesia.
