USITC REPORTS RESULTS OF SURVEY OF THE U.S. COLOR TV INDUSTRY

The United States International Trade Commission has completed its seventh quarterly survey of U.S. manufacturers of color television receivers to obtain data on economic factors indicative of conditions in the U.S. industry. The survey, required by Presidential Proclamation No. 4511, covers the fourth quarter of 1978. The Commission has previously reported data obtained for the fourth quarter of 1976, the year 1977, and the first three quarters of 1978 (USITC Publications 866, 886, 901, and 925).

The Commission has submitted detailed data in confidence to the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations who is responsible for monitoring the Orderly Marketing Agreement implemented by the Presidential Proclamation. Data which do not reveal operations of individual firms have been aggregated in USITC Publication 939. These monthly data cover January 1977 through December 1978 and show production, shipments, inventories, imports, employment, man-hours, and certain prices of U.S. producers. of the survey can be obtained by calling (202) 523-5178 or from the Office of the Secretary, United States International Trade Commission, 701 E St. NW, Washington, D.C. 20436.
