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
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USITC REPORTS RESULTS OF ANNUAL SURVEY OF PRODUCERS AND IMPORTERS OF NONRUBBER FOOTWEAR

The United States International Trade Commission has completed its second annual survey of U.S. producers and importers of nonrubber footwear in connection with the quantitative limitations imposed on imports of nonrubber footwear from Taiwan and the Republic of Korea. The survey, required by Presidential Proclamation No. 4510, covers the years 1977 and 1978.

Major findings of the survey indicate that nonrubber footwear producers' net pretax profit on their manufacturing operations increased from \$115.7 million in 1977 to \$133.7 million in 1978, or by 16 percent.

Nonrubber footwear prices of producers and importers were higher in 1978 than in 1977. Major categories showing significant shifts to higher prices were men's and women's leather dress and casual shoes and women's plastic dress and casual shoes.

Producers' yearend inventories of nonrubber footwear were 40.0 million pairs in 1978, compared with 36.1 million pairs in 1977, representing an increase of 11 percent. U.S. importers' inventories increased from 1977 to 1978 by 23 percent to 49.6 million pairs. Both U.S. producers and importers

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reported increased unfilled orders on January 1, 1979, compared with the previous year. Producers' orders increased from 64.5 million to 72.6 million pairs, and importers' orders increased from 79.5 million to 106.2 million pairs.

U.S. nonrubber footwear production capacity declined 1.8 percent while capacity utilization remained in the 75-percent range between 1977 and 1978. From 1977 to 1978, capital expenditures reported by U.S. producers increased 22 percent from \$51.5 million to \$63.0 million, and research and development expenditures increased 7 percent from \$8.3 million to \$8.9 million.

Data reported in the Commission's survey represent 85 percent of all nonrubber footwear shipments by U.S. importers and producers in 1978 and, in all, shipments of 652 million pairs of shoes were analyzed.

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**Summary Highlights of the Second Annual Survey of U.S. Producers
and Importers of Nonrubber Footwear**

The U.S. International Trade Commission herein reports the major findings of its second annual survey on nonrubber footwear, required under Presidential Proclamation No. 4510.

Profit.--U.S. producers reported that the ratio of operating profit (before taxes) to net sales on their entire footwear operations (manufacturing, purchasing, and retailing) was 5.8 percent in 1978 compared with 5.2 percent in 1977 (table 2). The ratio for their footwear manufacturing operations was 5.0 percent in 1978, compared with 4.4 percent in 1977 (table 3).

Prices.--Both importers' and producers' prices were higher in 1978 than in 1977. The type and price categories with the largest volume showed more rapid price increases between 1977 and 1978 than between 1976 and 1977 (tables 17 and 18). The following is a summary of the three largest-volume categories.

U.S. producers' and importers' inventories.--From 1977 to 1978 the yearend inventories reported by U.S. producers increased approximately 11 percent in quantity to 40.0 million pairs and 17 percent in value to \$312.3 million (table 7). U.S. importers' yearend inventories increased approximately 23 percent in quantity to 49.6 million pairs and 44 percent in value to \$311.8 million (table 8).

U.S. producers' and importers' unfilled orders.--U.S. producers reported unfilled orders of 72.6 million pairs on January 1, 1979, compared with 64.5 million pairs as of January 1, 1978 (table 9).

U.S. importers' unfilled orders were 106.2 million pairs on January 1, 1979, compared with 79.5 million pairs on January 1, 1978 (table 10).

Capacity and utilization of capacity.--U.S. producers' manufacturing capacity declined 1.8 percent from 1977 to 1978, from 541.5 million pairs to 531.9 million pairs (table 15). According to recently revised data, utilization of capacity stood at 75.8 percent in 1978, compared with 75.0 percent in 1977.

Capital expenditures and expenditures for research and development.--U.S. producers' capital expenditures increased from \$51.5 million in 1977 to \$63.0 million in 1978, or by 22 percent (table 4). The largest increases in expenditures were noted for new plants and machinery and equipment. Expenditures for research and development increased 7 percent, from \$8.3 million to \$8.9 million, during the same period.

Industry structure.--The industry trend towards increased concentration is continuing with a relatively small number of large producers accounting for a greater share of annual production. During the period 1969-77 the largest producers (with annual production of 4 million pairs or more) increased their share of total annual production from 37 percent to 53 percent (table 14).

Survey description.--Data compiled in this survey are from responses to Commission questionnaires, except where noted, and represent approximately 85 percent of U.S. producers' and importers' shipments for 1978. The information presented in this survey represent actual data received from U.S. producers and importers.

Since data reported in this survey are drawn from a sample larger than that in the Commission's first annual report (USITC Publication 889, May 1978), quantitative comparisons between the two reports may not always be meaningful. However, the data for both 1977 and 1978 contained in tables 2 through 16 in this report are from the larger sample and, therefore, may be used for comparison between the 2 years.
