DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION AS TO
U.S. PATENT NOS. 8,369,744; 8,565,640; 8,676,085; AND 8,135,304**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 11) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) terminating the investigation as to U.S. Patent Nos. 8,369,744; 8,565,640; 8,676,085; and 8,135,304.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, on June 12, 2014, based on a complaint filed by Canon Inc. of Japan; Canon U.S.A., Inc. of Melville, New York; and Canon Virginia, Inc. of Newport News, Virginia (collectively, “Canon”). The complaint alleges a violation of section 337 by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 8,280,278; 8,630,564; 8,682,215; 8,676,090; 8,369,744 (“the ‘744 patent”); 8,565,640 (“the ‘640 patent”); 8,676,085 (“the ‘085 patent”); 8,135,304 (“the ‘304 patent”); and 8,688,008 by numerous respondents. *79 Fed. Reg.* 33777-78 (Jun. 12, 2014).

Complainant Canon moved to partially terminate this investigation based on withdrawal of the complaint as to the following asserted claims: (1) claim 1 of the '744 patent (*i.e.*, all asserted claims); (2) claim 1 of the '640 patent (*i.e.*, all asserted claims); (3) claims 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the '085 patent (*i.e.*, all asserted claims); and (4) claim 1 of the '304 patent (*i.e.*, all asserted claims). Respondents International Laser Group, Inc.; Aster Graphics Co., Ltd.; Aster Graphics, Inc.; The Supply Guys, LLC; American Internet Holdings, LLC; Jiangxi Yibo E-Tech Co., Ltd.; ACM Technologies, Inc.; Ninestar Image Tech Limited; Zhuhai Seine Technology Co., Ltd.; Ninestar Technology Company, Ltd.; Seine Tech (USA) Co., Ltd.; Seine Image (USA) Co., Ltd.; Nano Pacific Corporation; Ink Technologies Printer Supplies, LLC; Linkyo Corp.; and Katun Corporation filed a joint response stating they do not oppose the motion. The Commission investigative attorney likewise filed a response indicating that he does not oppose the motion.

On August 14, 2014, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting Canon's motion. No party petitioned for review of the subject ID, and the Commission has determined not to review it.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. Part 210).
