**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DECISION NOT TO REVIEW AN
INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING THE TARGET DATE
AT APPROXIMATELY EIGHTEEN MONTHS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 3), which set the target date for completion of the investigation at approximately eighteen months (*i.e.*, May 7, 2019).

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on October 30, 2017, based on a complaint filed by Metglas, Inc. of Conway, South Carolina and Hitachi Metals, Ltd. of Tokyo, Japan. 82 FR 50156 (Oct. 30, 2017). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 by reason of misappropriation of trade secrets. *Id.* The notice of investigation named as respondents AT&M International Trading Co., Ltd., CISRI International Trading Co., Ltd., and Beijing ZLJG Amorphous Technology Co., Ltd., each of Beijing, China; as well as Qingdao Yunlu Energy Technology Co. of Qingdao, China. *Id.* at 50157. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party. *Id.*

On December 4, 2017, the ALJ issued the subject ID, which set the target date at eighteen and a quarter months. ID at 1-2; *see* 19 CFR 210.42(c)(1), 210.51(a)(1). The ID explains that setting the target date at such time is necessary because of the ALJ's obligations in other investigations. ID at 1-2.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR part 210).
