REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING AN EIGHTEEN-MONTH  
TARGET DATE FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE INVESTIGATION**

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 4) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”), setting an eighteen-month target date for the completion of the investigation.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on December 27, 2019, based on a complaint filed by Viavi Solutions Inc. of San Jose, California. 84 FR 71464 (Dec. 27, 2019). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain electronic devices with optical filters and optical sensor systems and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S.

Patent Nos. 9,588,269; 9,945,995; and 10,222,526 *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named as respondents Optrontec Inc. of Changwon, Republic of Korea; LG Electronics, Inc. of Seoul, Republic of Korea; LG Innotek Co., Ltd. of Seoul, Republic of Korea; and LG Electronics U.S.A, Inc. of Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is participating in this investigation. *Id.*

On January 10, 2020, the ALJ, pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a)(1) (19 CFR 210.51(a)(1)), issued the subject ID, setting the target date for the completion of the investigation as June 28, 2021, which is eighteen months after the institution of the investigation. A corrected order was issued on January 24, 2020. Under this schedule, the final ID is due by Monday, March 1, 2021. No petitions for review of the ID were received.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR part 210).
