**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION FINDING A RESPONDENT IN DEFAULT**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 32) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”), finding respondent Bald Shaver Inc. of Toronto, Canada (“Bald Shaver”) in default for failure to respond to the complaint and notice of investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On November 18, 2020, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Skull Shaver, LLC of Moorestown, New Jersey. 85 FR 73510-11 (Nov. 18, 2020). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of certain electric shavers and components and accessories thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 8,726,528 and D672,504. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation named eleven entities as respondents including Bald Shaver. The notice of investigation also named the Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“OUII”) as a party. *Id.*

On November 18, 2021, the ALJ issued the subject ID. The ID explains that Bald Shaver received service of the complaint and notice of investigation (“NOI”), but did not enter an appearance, participate in the investigation, or respond to the complaint and NOI. ID at 2. On

May 19, 2021, Skull Shaver moved to find Bald Shaver in default. *Id.* at 1. In response to that motion, the ALJ issued an order, Order No. 28 (Sept. 1, 2021), to Bald Shaver to show cause why it should not be found in default. *Id.* at 1. Bald Shaver did not respond. *Id.* at 2. The ID found Bald Shaver in default pursuant to Commission Rule 210.16(a)(1), 19 CFR 210.16(a)(1). *Id.* at 2. No petitions for review were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Per Commission Rule 210.16(a)(1), Bald Shaver is hereby found in default.

While temporary remote operating procedures are in place in response to COVID-19, the Office of the Secretary is not able to serve parties that have not retained counsel or otherwise provided a point of contact for electronic service. Accordingly, pursuant to Commission Rules 201.16(a) and 210.7(a)(1) (19 CFR 201.16(a), 210.7(a)(1)), the Commission orders that the complainant complete service for any party/parties without a method of electronic service noted on the attached Certificate of Service and shall file proof of service on the Electronic Document Information System (EDIS).

The Commission vote for this determination took place on December 9, 2021.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
