**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW
AN INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING THE TARGET DATE
FOR COMPLETING THE INVESTIGATION AT 17.5 MONTHS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 3) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”), setting the target date for completion of the investigation to October 28, 2022.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on May 14, 2021, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Roku, Inc. of San Jose, California. 86 FR 26542-543 (May 14, 2021). The complaint, as supplemented and amended, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain televisions, remote controls, and components thereof by reason of infringement of one or more claims of U.S. Patent No. 8,378,875 and U.S. Patent No. 7,388,511. The amended complaint further alleges that an industry in the United States exists or is in the process of being established. The Commission’s notice of investigation named eighteen respondents.

On May 21, 2021, the ALJ issued the subject ID setting the target date to October 28, 2022,


which would conclude the investigation in 17.5 months. The subject ID notes that the final initial determination on violation will be due no later than June 28, 2022. No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date is October 28, 2022.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 21, 2021.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 CFR Part 210.
