SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined to grant requests by the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") for judicial enforcement of subpoenas issued in this investigation to non-parties Broadcom Corporation ("Broadcom") and Zoran Corporation ("Zoran"), and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek such enforcement.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on April 17, 2012, based on a complaint filed by LSI Corporation of Milpitas, California and Agere Systems LLC (formerly Agere Systems Inc.) of Allentown, Pennsylvania. 77 Fed. Reg. 22803-04. The complaint, as amended, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of infringement of certain claims of the following U.S. Patent Nos: 5,870,087; 6,452,985; 6,707,867; and 6,982,663. The complaint further alleges the existence of a domestic industry. The Commission's notice of investigation named several

respondents including Funai Electric Company, Ltd. of Osaka, Japan; Funai Corporation, Inc. of Rutherford, New Jersey; and Funai Service Corporation of Groveport, Ohio.

On December 28, 2012 and January 9, 2013, respectively, complainants moved to obtain judicial enforcement of subpoenas *duces tecum* and subpoenas *ad testificandum* ("subpoenas") that issued on October 10 and 11, 2012, to non-parties Broadcom and Zoran. The ALJ granted complainants' motions on January 18 and February 4, 2013, respectively, in Order Nos. 56 and 59, and certified requests to the Commission for judicial enforcement of the subpoenas. The Commission has granted the ALJ's requests and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek judicial enforcement of the subpoenas.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and Commission Rule of Practice and Procedure 210.32(g), 19 C.F.R. § 210.32(g).
