**Pure Granular Magnesium from China**

**DETERMINATION**

On the basis of the record<sup>1</sup> developed in the subject five-year review, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the antidumping duty order on pure granular magnesium from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

**BACKGROUND**

The Commission, pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)), instituted this review on September 1, 2017 (82 F.R. 41651) and determined on December 5, 2017 that it would conduct an expedited review (83 F.R. 4269, January 30, 2018).

The Commission made this determination pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determination in this review on February 27, 2017. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 4761 (February 2018), entitled *Pure Granular Magnesium from China: Investigation No. 731-TA-895 (Third Review)*.
