## GENERAL EXCLUSION ORDER

Having determined that there is a violation of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the unauthorized U.S. importation and sale of the subject plastic light duty screw anchors, having examined the record in this investigation, including the written submissions of the parties on the issues of remedy, the public interest and bonding and having determined that the public interest factors listed in subsection 19 am section 337 (19 U.S.C. § 1337(d)) do not preclude the remedy ordered in paragraph 1, it is hereby ORDERED:

- 1. Plastic light duty screw anchors which infringe claim 1 of U.S. Letters Pat6nt 3,651,734 are excluded from entry into the United States for the remaining term of the patent, <u>i.e.</u>, until March 29, 1989, except where such importation is licensed by the patent owner.
- 2. Packaging (whether or not such packaging contains plastic light duty screw anchors) and literature containing depictions which infringe U.S. Trademark Registration No. 1,248,999 are excluded from entry into the United States, except where such importation is licensed by the trademark owner.
- 3. The excluded articles shall be entitled to entry under bond in the amount of 365 percent of the entered value of the imported articles from the day this Order is received by the President pursuant to subsection (j) of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (as amended by the Omnibus Trade and

Competitiveness Act of 1988 (102 Stat. 1213 (Aug. 23, 1988)) until such time as the President notifies

the Commission that he approves or disapproves this Order or, if the President fails to take such action,

no later than 60 days after the date on which the President receives this Order.

4. Notice of this Order shall be published in the <u>Federal Register</u>.

5. The Secretary shall serve copies of this Order and the Commission Opinion on Remedy, the Public

Interest, and Bonding on each party of record to this investigation and on the Department of Health and

Human Services, the Department of Justice, the Federal Trade Commission, and the Secretary of the

Treasury.
