ORDER

On September 21, 2005, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit issued a decision reversing the Commission's final determination in this investigation and remanding the case for further proceedings consistent with the Court's opinion. *U.S. Philips Corp. v. International Trade Commission*, 424 F.3d 1179 (Fed. Cir. 2005). The Court's mandate issued on December 27, 2005.

On January 17, 2006, the Commission issued an order seeking comments from the parties to the investigation as to how to proceed on remand. The Commission specifically requested comments as to how it should proceed with those portions of the October 24, 2003, final initial determination of the presiding administrative law judge upon which the Commission did not take a position.

On February 21, 2006, complainant U.S. Philips Corp. filed comments pursuant to the Commission's January 17, 2006, order. On the same day, respondents Princo Corp., Princo America Corp., Gigastorage Corp. Taiwan, Gigastorage Corp. USA, and Linberg Enterprise Inc. filed comments. On February 23, 2006, the Commission investigative attorney ("IA") filed comments, in which he, *inter alia*, requests that all parties be given the opportunity to respond to

the comments filed by the private parties. On March 10, 2006, complainant filed a memorandum

in reply to respondents' submission of February 21, 2006. The Commission deems this paper as

filed together with a motion for leave to reply.

Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that:

1. Within twenty-one days of service of this Order, each party shall submit a

response to the comments of the private parties filed on February 21, 2006.

2. Complainant's motion for leave to reply is denied without prejudice to resubmission of complainant's March 10, 2006, memorandum as part of

complainant's response.

3. The Secretary shall serve copies of this Order upon each party to this

investigation.
