**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE BY SIX DAYS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 100) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date by six days in the above-captioned investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 24, 2016, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Tessera Technologies, Inc.; Tessera, Inc.; and Invensas Corporation, all of San Jose, California. 81 *Fed. Reg.* 41344 (Jun. 24, 2016). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of infringement of certain claims of three patents. The notice of investigation named 24 respondents. 81 *Fed. Reg.* at 41344-45. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not participating in the investigation.

In Order No. 17, the ALJ set the target date at sixteen months (*i.e.*, October 24, 2017) with the final ID due on June 26, 2017. Order No. 17 at 2 (July 19, 2016). On June 23, 2017, the ALJ issued the subject ID, which extended the target date by six days. Order No. 100 at 2. The ALJ explained, *inter alia*, that additional time was needed to complete the final ID because of the ALJ's responsibilities in other investigations. *Id.* at 1. The final ID issued on June 30, 2017. As a result of Order No. 100, the target date for completion of the investigation is now October 30, 2017.

No petitions for review were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 C.F.R. Part 210.
