NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION PARTIALLY TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION BY WITHDRAWAL OF CERTAIN PATENT CLAIMS

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (the "Commission") has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 27) granting an unopposed motion to partially terminate the above-referenced investigation by withdrawing certain patent claims.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On June 11, 2018, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint and supplement thereto filed by The Chamberlain Group, Inc. ("Chamberlain") of San Jose, CA. 83 FR 27020 (June 11, 2018). The complaint alleged a violation of 19 U.S.C. 1337, as amended ("Section 337"), in the importation, sale for importation, or sale in the United States after importation of certain movable barrier operator systems and components thereof that infringe one or more of the asserted claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 8,587,404 ("the '404 patent"), 7,755,223 ("the '223 patent"), and 6,741,052 ("the '052 patent"). *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named Nortek Security & Control, LLC of Carlsbad, CA; Nortek, Inc. of Providence, RI; and GTO Access Systems, LLC of Tallahassee,

FL (collectively "Nortek") as respondents. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was not named as a party to this investigation.

On June 6, 2019, Chamberlain filed an unopposed motion under 19 CFR 210.21(a) for partial termination of this investigation based on withdrawing claim 16 of the '404 patent and claim 20 of the '233 patent. Chamberlain further asserted, pursuant to 19 CFR 210.21(a)(1), that there are no other agreements, written or oral, express or implied, between the parties concerning the subject matter of the investigation. No responses to the motion were filed.

On June 7, 2019, the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") issued the subject ID (Order No. 27), pursuant to 19 CFR 210.21(a)(1), granting Chamberlain's unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation by withdrawing claim 16 of the '404 patent and claim 20 of the '223 patent. The ALJ found no extraordinary circumstances that would justify denying Chamberlain's motion. No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
