**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 48) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date for this investigation until November 25, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On March 12, 2024, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsara of San Francisco, CA. 89 FR 19356 (March 18, 2024). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 USC 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain vehicle telematics, fleet management, and video-based safety systems, devices, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 11,190,373; 11,127,130; and 11,611,621 (“the ’621 patent”). The Commission’s notice of investigation (“NOI”) named Motive Technologies Inc. (“Motive”) of San Francisco, CA as the respondent. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“OUII”) was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On December 19, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 48), extending the target date to November 25, 2025, pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51 (19 CFR 210.51). *See* Order No. 48, at 1. The ID states, “Extending the target date will allow the evidentiary hearing

to be re-scheduled and give . . . adequate time to draft the final initial determination while also attending to . . . responsibilities in other investigations.” *Id.*

No party filed a petition for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID (Order No. 48). The target date for this investigation is extended until November 25, 2025. Any final initial determination is due no later than July 25, 2025.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on January 13, 2025.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
