**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL  
DETERMINATION GRANTING COMPLAINANTS' UNOPPOSED MOTION TO  
PARTIALLY TERMINATE THE INVESTIGATION AS TO CERTAIN CLAIMS  
BASED UPON WITHDRAWAL OF ALLEGATIONS PERTAINING TO THOSE  
CLAIMS FROM THE COMPLAINT**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 16) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") granting an unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation as to claims 13, 15, 18, and 20 of United States Patent No. 6,084,565 ("the '565 patent"); claims 2, 5, and 6 of United States Patent No. 6,424,292 ("the '292 patent"); claims 2, 4, 6-10, 14 of United States Patent No. 7,161,561 ("the '561 patent"); and claims 2, 4, 5, and 8-25 of United States Patent No. 7,768,447 ("the '447 patent") based upon withdrawal of allegations pertaining to those claims from the complaint.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted Inv. No. 337-TA-900 on

November 15, 2013, based on a complaint filed by Furuno Electric Co., Ltd. of Hyogo, Japan and Furuno U.S.A., Inc. of Camas, Washington (“Furuno”). 78 *Fed. Reg.* 68861-862 (Nov. 15, 2013). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain navigation products, including GPS devices, navigation and display systems, radar systems, navigational aids, mapping systems and related software by reason of infringement of certain claims of the ’565, ’292, ’561, and ’447 patents. The complaint named several respondents.

On April 3, 2014, Furuno filed an unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation as to claims 13, 15, 18, and 20 of the ’565 patent; claims 2, 5, and 6 of the ’292 patent; claims 2, 4, 6-10, and 14 of the ’561 patent; and claims 2, 4, 5, and 8-25 of the ’447 patent. On April 14, 2014, the Commission investigative attorney filed a response in support of the motion. On April 16, 2014, Furuno filed a corrected unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation based on withdrawal of the same claims.

On April 16, 2014, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting the corrected unopposed motion. The ALJ indicated that the motion complied with the requirements of Commission Rule 210.21(a)(1) (19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1)) and found that no extraordinary circumstances prohibited granting the motion. None of the parties petitioned for review of the ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. Part 210).
