- 16 concerning imports of Uncoated Groundwood Paper from

- 18 Welcome to Ms. Haines and the staff who
- 19 participated in these investigations. Are there any
- 20 questions for the staff?

- 22 CHAIRMAN SCHMIDTLEIN: Are there any additions or
- 23 corrections to the staff report?
- 24 MS. HAINES: Elizabeth Haines, revisions are
- 25 contained in the memo INV-PP-123.

- 4 CHAIRMAN SCHMIDTLEIN: Hearing none, it is

- 6 Madam Secretary, will you please call the roll?
- 7 MS. BARTON: Thank you Madam Chairman.
- 8 Commissioner Broadbent?
- 9 COMMISSIONER BROADBENT: I vote in the
- 10 affirmative.
- MS. BARTON: Commissioner Williamson?
- 12 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMSON: I vote in the

- 12 assembled into other products.
- 13 Welcome to Mr. Anderson and the staff who
- 14 participated in this investigation.
- 15 I want to take a moment to thank his team for the
- 16 tremendous effort and outstanding work that they've done.
- 17 This is the first Section 201 Safequard investigation at
- 18 the Commission in over 15 years, and I know that for many
- 19 of you, and I'll include myself in this, there has been a
- 20 steep learning curve.
- 21 I know that there has been an exceptionally large
- 22 volume of data to deal with in this case, as demonstrated
- 23 by the staff report that is over 500 pages long. So again I
- 24 want to thank you all for your hard work on this case.
- 25 Are there any questions for the staff?

- 12 everyone that the determination the Commission is making
- 13 today, is whether CSPV cells, whether or not partially or
- 14 fully assembled into other products, are being imported
- 15 into the United States in such increased quantities as to
- 16 be a substantial cause of serious injury or threat thereof
- 17 to the domestic industry, producing an article like or
- 18 directly competitive with the imported article.
- 19 If a Commissioner reaches an affirmative
- 20 determination with respect to overall injury, there are
- 21 some additional findings required by the implementing
- 22 statutes of certain U.S. free trade agreements.
- 23 To the extent that a Commissioner votes in the
- 24 affirmative this morning, with regard to injury overall,
- 25 the Commissioner may also choose to announce their findings

- 1 with respect to certain FTA countries.
- Madam Secretary, will you please call the roll?
- 3 MS. BARTON: Thank you Madam Chairman.
- 4 Commissioner Schmidtlein?
- 5 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDTLEIN: I vote in the
- 6 affirmative and determine that CSPV cells whether or not
- 7 partially or fully assembled into other products, are being
- 8 imported into the United States in such increased
- 9 quantities as to be a substantial cause of serious injury
- 10 to the domestic industry.
- 11 With respect to the NAFTA countries, I find that
- 12 imports from Canada and Mexico each account for a
- 13 substantial share of total imports and contribute
- 14 importantly to the serious injury caused by imports.
- 15 With respect to Korea, I find that imports from
- 16 Korea are a substantial cause of serious injury or threat
- 17 thereof. With respect to imports from all other relevant
- 18 FTA partners, I find that those imports are not a
- 19 substantial cause of injury or threat thereof.
- 20 MS. BARTON: Commissioner Johanson?
- 21 COMMISSIONER JOHANSON: I vote in the affirmative
- 22 and determine that Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells
- 23 or CSPV cells whether or not partially or fully assembled
- 24 into other products are being imported into the United
- 25 States in such increased quantities as to be a substantial

1 cause of serious injury to the domestic industry producing

- 2 an article like or directly competitive with the imported
- 3 article.
- 4 With respect to the North American Free Trade
- 5 Agreement countries, I make an affirmative finding with
- 6 respect to imports from Mexico, and a negative finding with
- 7 respect to imports from Canada.
- 8 With respect to imports from Korea, I make an
- 9 affirmative finding. With respect to imports from
- 10 Australia, the Dominican Republic, Central American Free
- 11 Trade Agreement countries: Columbia, Jordan, Panama, Peru
- 12 and Singapore, I make a negative finding.
- MS. BARTON: Commissioner Williamson?
- 14 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMSON: I vote in the
- 15 affirmative and determine that CSPV cells whether or not
- 16 partially or fully assembled into other products, are being
