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3 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Good morning. This meeting
4 of the U.S. International Trade Commission will now come to
5 order.

6 I understand that there are no agendas for future
7 meetings or Outstanding Action Jackets to consider.

8 Is there any objection to approval of the minutes
9 of March 6th, 12th, 14th, 20th, 21st, 27th, and 29th, 2019,
10 or Ratification List 19-003?

11 (No response.)

12 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Hearing none, they are
13 approved.

14 Next we turn to the vote on the Final Phase of
15 Investigation Number 701-TA-596--595 to 596, 731-TA-1401,
16 1403, and 1405 to 1406, concerning Imports of Large Diameter
17 Welded Pipe from Canada, Greece, Korea, and Turkey.

18 Welcome to Mr. Corkran and the staff who
19 participated in these investigations.

20 Are there any questions for the staff?

22 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Are there any additions or
23 corrections to the staff report?

24 MR. CORKRAN: Douglas Corkran, Office of
25 Investigations. Chairman Johanson, staff proposes revising

1 the staff report in accordance with Memorandum INV RR 022,
2 dated April 1, 2019. Staff has no additional additions or
3 corrections.

4 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Is there any objection to
5 approval of the staff report as revised?

6 (No response.)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Hearing none, it is approved.
8 Mr. Secretary, will you please call the roll.

9 MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Broadbent.

10 COMMISSIONER BROADBENT: With respect to LDW
11 Carbon and Alloy Steel-Lined Pipe, I vote to terminate the
12 countervailing duty investigation of Line Pipe Imports from
13 Turkey. I vote negative with respect to all other
14 investigations of Line Pipe Imports.

15 With respect to LDW Carbon and Alloy Steel
16 Structural Pipe, I vote to terminate the antidumping duty
17 investigation of structural pipe imports from Greece.

18 I vote affirmative with respect to all other
19 investigations of structural pipe imports.

20 With respect to LDW Stainless Steel Pipe, I vote
21 to terminate the investigations of stainless steel pipe
22 imports from Greece and Turkey. I vote negative with
23 respect to the investigations of stainless steel pipe
24 imports from Canada and Korea.

25 MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Johanson.

1 COMMISSIONER JOHANSON: With respect to large
2 diameter welded line pipe, I vote in the affirmative with
3 respect to the antidumping duty investigations of line pipe
4 imports from Canada, Greece, Korea, and Turkey.

5 I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
6 countervailing duty investigation of line pipe imports from
7 Korea.

8 I vote to terminate the countervailing duty
9 investigation of line pipe imports from Turkey.

10 With respect to large-diameter welded structural
11 pipe, I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
12 antidumping duty investigations of structural pipe imports
13 from Canada, Korea, and Turkey.

14 I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
15 countervailing duty investigations of structural pipe
16 imports from Korea and Turkey.

17 I vote to terminate the antidumping duty
18 investigation of structural pipe imports from Greece.

19 With respect to large-diameter welded stainless
20 pipe, I vote in the negative with respect to the antidumping
21 duty investigations of stainless pipe imports from Canada
22 and Korea.

23 I vote in the negative with respect to the
24 countervailing duty investigation of stainless pipe imports
25 from Korea.

1 I vote to terminate the antidumping duty
2 investigations of stainless pipe imports from Greece and
3 Turkey. And I vote to terminate the countervailing duty
4 investigation of stainless pipe imports from Turkey.

5 MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Williamson.

6 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMSON: I concur with Chairman
7 Johanson with respect to all issues. Thank you.

8 MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Kearns.

9 COMMISSIONER KEARNS: With respect to
10 large-diameter welded carbon and alloy steel pipe, I vote in
11 the affirmative with respect to antidumping duty
12 investigations of those products from Canada, Greece, Korea,
13 and Turkey. I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
14 countervailing duty investigations of those products from
15 Korea. I vote to terminate the countervailing duty
16 investigation of those products from Turkey.

17 With respect to large-diameter welded stainless
18 steel pipe, I vote in the negative with respect to the
19 antidumping investigations of those products from Canada and
20 Korea. I vote in the negative with respect to the
21 countervailing duty investigation of stainless steel pipe
22 imports from Korea. I vote to terminate the antidumping
23 duty investigations of stainless steel pipe imports from
24 Greece and Turkey. And I vote to terminate the
25 countervailing duty investigation of stainless steel pipe

1 imports from Turkey.

2 MR. BISHOP: Commissioner Schmidtlein.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDTLEIN: With respect to
4 large-diameter welded line pipe, I vote in the affirmative
5 with respect to the antidumping duty investigations of line
6 pipe from Canada, Greece, Korea, and Turkey.

7 I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
8 countervailing duty investigation of line pipe from Korea.
9 And I vote to terminate the countervailing duty
10 investigation of line pipe from Turkey.

11 With respect to large-diameter welded structural
12 pipe, I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
13 antidumping duty investigations of structural pipe from
14 Canada, Korea, and Turkey.

15 I vote in the affirmative with respect to the
16 countervailing duty investigation of structural pipe from
17 Korea and Turkey. And I vote to terminate the antidumping
18 duty investigation of structural pipe from Greece.

19 With respect to large-diameter welded stainless
20 steel pipe, I vote in the negative with respect to the
21 antidumping duty investigation of stainless steel pipe from
22 Canada and Korea. I vote in the negative with respect to
23 the countervailing duty investigation of stainless steel
24 pipe from Korea.

25 I vote to terminate the antidumping duty

1 investigation of stainless steel pipe from Greece and
2 Turkey. And I vote to terminate the countervailing duty
3 investigation of stainless steel pipe from Turkey.

4 MR. BISHOP: Mr. Chairman, with respect to line
5 pipe, the Commission has made affirmative determinations
6 with respect to the antidumping duty investigations of line
7 pipe from Canada, Greece, Korea, and Turkey.

8 The Commission has made an affirmative
9 determination with respect to the countervailing duty
10 investigation of line pipe from Korea.

11 The Commission has terminated the countervailing
12 duty investigation of line pipe from Turkey.

13 With respect to structural pipe, the Commission
14 has made affirmative determinations with respect to the
15 antidumping duty investigations of structural pipe Canada,
16 Korea, and Turkey.

17 The Commission has made affirmative
18 determinations with respect to the countervailing duty
19 investigations of structural pipe from Korea and Turkey.

20 The Commission has terminated the antidumping
21 duty investigation of structural pipe from Greece.

22 With respect to stainless steel pipe, the
23 Commission has made negative determinations with respect to
24 the antidumping duty investigations of stainless steel pipe
25 from Canada and Korea.

1 The Commission has made a negative determination
2 with respect to the countervailing duty investigation of
3 stainless steel pipe from Korea.

4 The Commission has terminated the antidumping
5 duty investigations of stainless steel pipe from Greece and
6 Turkey.

7 The Commission has terminated the countervailing
8 duty investigation of stainless steel pipe from Turkey.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHANSON: Thank you, Mr. Secretary.
10 Further information concerning these determinations will be
11 in the press release. Views of the Commission are currently
12 scheduled to be completed and filed by April 15th, 2019.
13 Thank you to all staff who participated in these
14 investigations. Seeing that there is no other business
15 before the Commission, this meeting is adjourned.
