## Dear Counsel:

Thank you for your continued patience and cooperation as the Commission proceeds with an inperson hearing format going forward. I am providing information and guidance on procedures for Inv. Nos. 701-TA-560-561 and 731-TA-1317-1328 (Review), Carbon and Alloy Steel Cut-To-Length Plate from Austria, Belgium, Brazil, China, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, South Africa, South Korea, Taiwan, and Turkey.

With the reopening of the building to the public on September 29, 2022, the Commission will conduct its public hearing via in-person format to include in-person and virtual attendance. The proceeding schedule for this hybrid hearing is as follows (all times EDT):

- Monday, November 7, 2022 by 5:15 p.m.: Parties submit requests to testify.
  - Any requests to appear as a **witness via videoconference** must be included with your request to appear. Requests to appear via videoconference must include a statement explaining why the witness cannot appear in person; the Chairman, or other person designated to conduct the investigation, may in their discretion for good cause shown, grant such a request.
  - Requests to appear as **remote witness** due to illness or a positive COVID-19 test result may be submitted by 3pm the business day prior to the hearing.
  - If the District of Columbia community levels reach HIGH, the hearing will be virtual using the WebEx platform.

## • Monday, November 14, 2022 by 4:00 p.m.:

Parties must submit (via EDIS) and serve witness testimony <u>and presentation slides</u> on all parties on the public service list; must include the certification as required by 19 CFR 201.8(e). Note that this is not intended to replace oral testimony, but rather to help ensure that Commissioners, Commission staff, and fellow parties are able to follow along in the event we encounter any technical difficulties during the Hybrid proceeding. This does not include opening/closing remarks. Paper copies at the hearing are not required. All presentations must be shown via Webex.
