EXPLANATION OF COMMISSION DETERMINATIONS ON ADEQUACY

Stainless Steel Butt-Weld Pipe Fittings from Italy, Malaysia, and the Philippines Inv. Nos. 731-TA-865-867 (Third Review)

On September 5, 2017, the Commission unanimously determined to conduct expedited reviews in the subject five-year reviews pursuant to section 751(c)(3)(B) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)(3)(B).

The Commission received a response to the notice of institution filed on behalf of three domestic producers of stainless steel butt-weld pipe fittings.¹ The Commission found each domestic interested party's response to be individually adequate. Because the responding domestic producers accounted for a substantial portion of U.S. stainless steel butt-weld pipe fittings production in 2016, the Commission determined that the domestic interested party group response was adequate.

The Commission did not receive any response to the notice of institution from any respondent interested party. Consequently, the Commission determined that the respondent interested party group response was inadequate for each order under review.

The Commission did not find any circumstances that would warrant conducting full reviews and determined to conduct expedited reviews of the orders.
