EXPLANATION OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION ON ADEQUACY

Wooden Bedroom Furniture from China Inv. No. 731-TA-1058 (Third Review)

On April 8, 2022, the Commission determined to conduct an expedited review in the subject five-year review pursuant to section 751(c)(3)(B) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)(3)(B).

The Commission received a joint response to the notice of institution from the American Furniture Manufacturers Committee for Legal Trade ("Committee") and Vaughan-Bassett Furniture Company, Inc. ("Vaughan-Bassett"). Vaughan-Bassett and the other members of the Committee are domestic producers of wooden bedroom furniture ("WBF").¹ The Commission found each of the domestic producers' individual responses to be adequate. The Commission further determined that the domestic interested party group response was adequate because these domestic producers accounted for a substantial share of domestic WBF production in 2021.

The Commission did not receive a response to the notice of institution from any respondent interested party. Consequently, the Commission determined that the respondent interested party group response was inadequate.

The Commission also found that there were no other circumstances warranting a full review. Therefore, the Commission determined to conduct an expedited review of the order.
