A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on Pyrimethanil.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PYRIMETHANIL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.10.36 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Pyrimethanil) is amended by striking the date in the effec-
7 tive period column and inserting “12/31/2015”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 this section applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
